Mini-warehouse facility on property located in the Community Commercial (CC) Zone.

Waldorf 301 Developers, LLC is requesting Special Exception use approval from the Board of Appeals to develop a mini-warehouse facility, as provided in Article XIII, § 297-212, Use #7.02.230 and Article XXV, § 297-415, of the *Charles County Zoning Ordinance*. The proposed project site is located 2390 Crain Highway in Waldorf, designated as Tax Map 8, Grid 11, Parcels 309 and 675. These parcels are collectively comprised of 4.43 acres, with Parcel 309 being 3.77 acres and Parcel 675 being 0.66 acres. Both parcels are located entirely within the Community Commercial (CC) Zone. Under a separate subdivision application, these parcels are proposed to be consolidated and re-subdivided into a Parcel A consisting of 2.01 acres and a Parcel B consisting of 2.36 acres. The Mini-warehouse facility, subject to this petition, is proposed on Parcel B.
