#### Variance from use standards of Section 297-212 (32) 3.04.220 C requiring building and play area facilities to be 50-ft away from adjacent residential use.

The applicant Bridget Delmar-McPherson owner of Mission Educate Learning Center is requesting a variance from the use standards of Section 297-212 (32) 3.04.220. C of the Charles County Zoning Ordinance, which states that, "The building and play area facilities shall be at least 50 feet from any adjacent residential lot or use." The proposed project site is located at 3325 Middletown Rd., in Waldorf, Maryland, designated as Tax Map 14, Grid 3, Parcel 75, consisting of approximately 4.70 acres of land. The property is located within the Watershed Conservation District (WCD).
