

Community Services:	<p>Staff have reached out to the licensed Assisted Living providers in Charles County to assess how they're doing with COVID-19 management & if they have any pressing needs. Here is the consensus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Licensed Assisted Living Facilities (ALF's) in Charles County are following the guidelines from Maryland Dept. of Health (MDH) which outlines recommendations for infection control practices and prevention of the spread of COVID-19. - MDH also emphasizes the guidelines set forth by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. As a result, the ALF's promptly implemented restrictions for visitation, etc. Family/friends of Assisted Living residents are encouraged to call, but not visit, in order to maintain contact with their loved ones. - Restrictions are in place preventing visitors and non-essential health care personnel to their facilities. - Assisted Living residents are not attending any external adult daycare programs <p>-Only medically necessary physician appointments are being kept.</p> <p>- Site visits from my Dept's case managers & social workers have been eliminated; essential client communications &/or 'well checks' are being conducted via phone, email, and Skype/Facetime, as necessary</p> <p>Family and Child Services Contractor Status:</p> <p>Maryland Coalition of Families</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Family Navigation: All face to face interactions have stopped. The public currently accesses MCF services remotely by calling our statewide intake line or emailing us. Lifestyles:	<p><i>Currently, there is not a location for quarantine of a homeless individual in Charles County if they are affected by COVID-19. LifeStyles plans to do the following to develop its quarantine plan for those homeless individuals that we have identified as part of our existing services in the county:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Transition the current participants and Resident Assistant (3 total individuals) to Gayle's House for shared housing by Sunday, March 22nd</i> ▪ <i>Utilize Martha's Place as an isolation point for any homeless individuals that LifeStyles is aware of and has worked with before for quarantine</i> ▪ <i>Have Martha's Place professionally cleaned with the county's support before transitioning any persons back to the home once the crisis is removed</i> ▪ <i>Any staff or other individuals who had contact with the quarantined individual will be referred for testing (if not covered by their private insurance LifeStyles will assist). That staff will be asked to complete the isolation as required by medical professionals and not return to work until the isolation period is complete. Those staff will be compensated for their time off based upon the schedule they agreed to work.</i> <p>Setting up 10 "Charles County Cares Cabanas" with food, SNAP applications, and COVID19 informational flyers. MARYLAND Declaration 16376

(Disaster MD-00041)

Incident: **CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)**

occurring: January 31, 2020 & continuing

All counties within the State of Maryland; and contiguous District of Columbia; the contiguous Delaware counties of: Kent, New Castle, and Sussex; the contiguous Pennsylvania counties of: Adams, Bedford, Chester, Fayette, Franklin, Fulton, Lancaster, Somerset, and York; the contiguous Virginia counties of: Accomack, Alexandria (City), Arlington, Fairfax, and Loudoun; and the contiguous West Virginia counties of: Berkeley, Grant, Hampshire, Jefferson, Mineral, Morgan and Preston

Application Filing Deadline: December 21, 2020

Disaster Loan Assistance Available:

Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) – Working capital loans to help small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture, and most private, non-profit organizations of all sizes meet their ordinary and necessary financial obligations that cannot be met as a direct result of the disaster. These loans are intended to assist through the disaster recovery period.

Credit Requirements:

- Credit History – Applicants must have a credit history acceptable to SBA.
- Repayment – Applicants must show the ability to repay the loan.
- Collateral – Collateral is required for all EIDL loans over \$25,000. SBA takes real estate as collateral when it is available. SBA will not decline a loan for lack of collateral, but SBA will require the borrower to pledge collateral that is available.

Interest Rates:

The interest rate is determined by formulas set by law and is fixed for the life of the loan. The maximum interest rate for this program is 3.750 percent.

Loan Terms:

The law authorizes loan terms up to a maximum of 30 years. SBA will determine an appropriate installment payment based on the financial condition of each borrower, which in turn will determine the loan term.

Loan Amount Limit:

The law limits EIDLs to \$2,000,000 for alleviating economic injury caused by the disaster. The actual amount of each loan is limited to the economic injury determined by SBA, less business interruption insurance and other recoveries up to the administrative lending limit. SBA also considers potential contributions that are available from the business and/or its owner(s) or affiliates. If a business is a major source of employment, SBA has the authority to waive the \$2,000,000 statutory limit.

Loan Eligibility Restrictions:

Noncompliance – Applicants who have not complied with the terms of previous SBA loans may not be eligible. This includes borrowers who did not maintain required flood insurance and/or hazard insurance on previous SBA loans.

Note: Loan applicants should check with agencies / organizations administering any grant or other assistance program under this declaration to determine how an approval of SBA disaster loan might affect their eligibility.

Refinancing:

Economic injury disaster loans cannot be used to refinance long term debts.

Insurance Requirements:

To protect each borrower and the Agency, SBA may require you to obtain and maintain appropriate insurance. By law, borrowers whose damaged or collateral property is located in a special flood hazard area must purchase and maintain flood insurance. SBA requires that flood insurance coverage be the lesser of 1) the total of the disaster loan, 2) the insurable value of the property, or 3) the maximum insurance available.
