

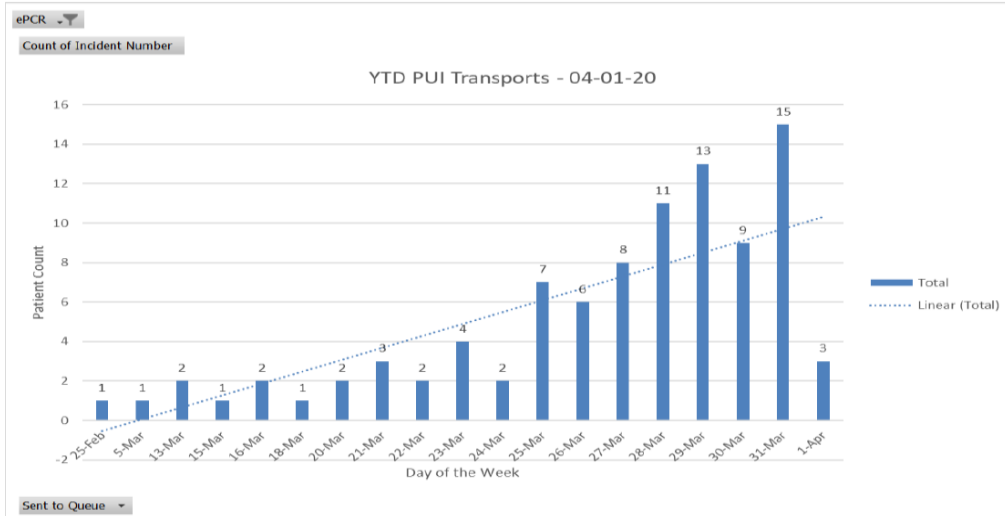

All were discharged to home for self-care. 6 presented with Ill. Diagnoses included allergies, sinusitis, and acute upper respiratory infection.</p> <p>ESSENCE ED visit data for the University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center also shows no high utilization alert or warning for 3/31. There were 74 ED patients on 3/30. The epidemiologist read the reports on each case where the chief complaint included flu like symptoms {N=25 for 3/30}. COVID-19 PUI was listed in the provider diagnosis and notes for 4 cases. ESSENCE does not indicate any admissions.
