

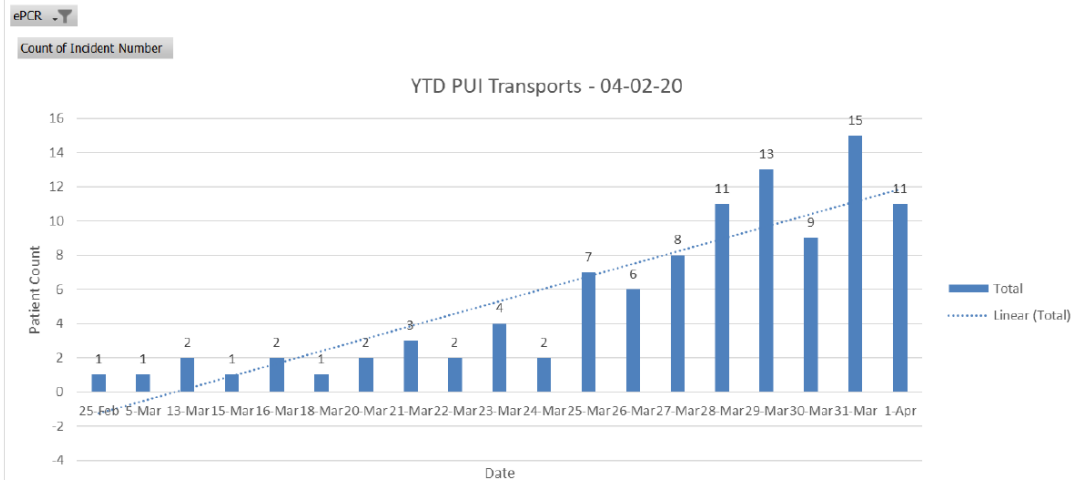

Updated Hours of Operation, Starting April 1: Monday-Sunday, 8 a.m. to 10 p.m.

The Charles County Department of Health call center is available to respond to your urgent question or concern.

Today the Maryland Department of Health announced that they will begin offering drive-through COVID-19 testing to residents who are symptomatic and at high risk for complications from the disease. A site is opening in Waldorf on Apr. 1 and will be open on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. More details are available on the MDH web page.

Testing requirements are in place and you must have a doctor's order and a confirmed appointment to come to the site. Please review detailed FAQs about Coronavirus testing and VEIP testing sites before coming to the Waldorf location, or any other location designated for this purpose.

You can watch the daily update from Charles County's Government's YouTube channel or podcast to hear more about the testing site details, as well as updates on the number of confirmed cases locally, along with information for small businesses, unemployment assistance, and more.

The Board of County Commissioners held their first virtual meeting today, which you watch here. The news release summary has also been emailed to you.

As many of you know, earlier today Governor Hogan ordered all Maryland residents to stay at home, unless leaving the home is required to take care of family members and their needs, pursue allowable business activities, pursue necessary government work, or maintain minimum operations for closed businesses. 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ESSENCE data for urgent care utilization at Patient First in Waldorf saw a small decrease in patients from Tuesday, 3/31 to Wednesday, April 1. 31 patients presented for a multitude of symptoms. All were discharged to home for self-care. 15 presented with Ill. Diagnoses included allergies rhinitis, sinusitis, pharyngitis, acute bronchitis, influenza with no respiratory manifest, and unspecified viral infection.

ESSENCE ED visit data for the University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center also shows no high utilization alert or warning for 4/1. There were 63 ED patients on 4/1. This is a small decrease from the number reported for 3/31(N=75). The epidemiologist read the reports on each case where the chief complaint included flu like or possible COVID-19 symptoms (N=19 for 4/1). COVID-19 case or COVID-19 PUI was listed in the provider diagnosis and notes for 7 cases. ESSENCE does not indicate any admissions; however, the discharge disposition was left as "none" for 15 people. No deaths reported for 4/1.



Lifestyles:	<p>Coordination</p> <p><i>Street outreach continues. Increased need for water and hygiene items. The Homeless Alert text system works well in notifying this population.</i></p> <p><i>Continuing conversation with the EOC and HD regarding shelters, staffing, isolation and quarantine. Delegate Davis facilitated a conference call with Baltimore City Homeless Services Team that provided valuable information regarding ideas that they have tried as well as actions that they found were not beneficial.</i></p> <p><i>We are working with property owners regarding sanitation stations and assistance for the homeless with EOC. We have received necessary documents for owners to sign allowing the county to proceed. We will have three of the agreements signed on 4/3/2020. This will address sanitation at homeless encampments</i></p> <p>Food services</p> <p><i>End Hunger in Charles County is working collaboratively to provide emergency food, prepared meals, and other meal items to children and households in need. The goal is to work in a coordinated effort to maximize all available resources and to avoid duplication of effort. The organization will assist existing programs through funding and other resources as needed. We have partnered with agencies to provide the following services in Charles County:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Community Cabanas: LifeStyles is working with volunteers to build, install, and maintain ten cabanas throughout the community, located in areas such as Waldorf, La Plata, Indian Head, and Nanjemoy. These cabanas will provide</i>

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necessities, such as toiletry items, ready-to-eat food, and water, for those in need. This drive-through process will be maintained by volunteers who will provide services each weekday from 11am – 3pm. This is done through a partnership with End Hunger and Charles County Government.

- *Meal deliveries: LifeStyles in partnership with other providers and Charles County Public Schools are coordinating the delivery of meals for households with school-age children that are not able to access the daily school meal distribution sites, to seniors who are homebound, and also for those that are homeless that need access to nutritious meals. These meal deliveries are scheduled for weekday deliveries, utilizing homebound delivery protocols developed by the Maryland Food Bank. When the purchase of groceries is more efficient and economic it will be used as an alternative. Households must be pre-approved and requests for same-day delivery may be considered but not a guarantee of availability.*

Activation will be determined by both staffing levels and patient census presenting to the ED.</i></p> <p><i>The hospital census for today 4/2/2020 = 83</i> <i>Confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 patient admissions in-house 4/2/2020 = 19</i> <i>PUI's in-house 4/2/2020 = 2</i> <i>There was 1 patient that tested Positive for COVID-19 that was brought in by EMS on 4/01/2020</i> <i>There were 0 PUI brought in by EMS 4/01/2020 of which the test result has not yet been received</i> <i>CRMC developed a SOP for the ED staff so that all shifts and ED personnel have the defined procedure. Communications Center will alert CRMC. 3. CRMC ED will send staff out to meet the ambulance. 4. Handover of patient care will occur in the Ambulance Bay. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. CRMC ED RN will present to the Ambulance with stretcher or wheelchair as appropriate. b. Handover report should be concise so timely transition can occur. c. RN will use Radio to contact Resource RN to determine room placement. 5. Ambulance Decontamination and resupply procedures will be conducted outside of the ED. 6. EMS clinicians should not need to enter the ED while "curbside" ED services are in operation.

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	<p><i>CRMC is dedicating one unit specifically to be for COVID-19 positive patients or for PUI's that have been admitted to the hospital. The dedicated COVID-19 unit will be 3 south until further notice. That process is underway and should be fully operational before end of day 4/2/2020.</i></p> <p><i>Number of ICU beds in-house. Number of ICU beds available =</i></p> <p><i>Number of ventilators owned by CRMC = 17. As of 4/2/2020 there are 7 patients on ventilators and of those 7, 2 of the patients are positive for COVID-19.</i></p>
