

	<p>The Charles County Department of Health call center is available to respond to your urgent question or concern.</p> <p>Today the Maryland Department of Health announced that they will begin offering drive-through COVID-19 testing to residents who are symptomatic and at high risk for complications from the disease. A site is opening in Waldorf on Apr. 1 and will be open on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. More details are available on the MDH web page.</p> <p>Testing requirements are in place and you must have a doctor's order and a confirmed appointment to come to the site. Please review detailed FAQs about Coronavirus testing and VEIP testing sites before coming to the Waldorf location, or any other location designated for this purpose.</p> <p>You can watch the daily update from Charles County's Government's YouTube channel or podcast to hear more about the testing site details, as well as updates on the number of confirmed cases locally, along with information for small businesses, unemployment assistance, and more.</p> <p>The Board of County Commissioners held their first virtual meeting today, which you can watch here. The news release summary has also been emailed to you.</p> <p>Finally, if you have any further questions or concerns, you can always call (or advise others) to contact our Health Department's Call Center at 301-609-6717.</p> <p>As many of you know, earlier today Governor Hogan ordered all Maryland residents to stay at home, unless leaving the home is required to take care of family members and their needs, pursue allowable business activities, pursue necessary government work, or maintain minimum operations for closed businesses. <p>Medical isolation/quarantine for vulnerable populations:</p>	<p><i>Pre-approval from FEMA for non-congregate care shelter has been received. Draft plans have been submitted for all parties to review and we are awaiting agreement, but we will be using the draft should we have to shelter this weekend.</i></p> <p><i>Still waiting for signed hold harmless agreements to be sent back to the County for execution. We will deliver the porta potties and sanitation stations upon execution of the agreements. Will be delivering porta-potties and sanitation stations to the higher population homeless encampments in the County.</i></p> <p>Coordinating with DSS, Lifestyles, & HD to provide shelter to vulnerable populations that have no location to isolate at.</p> <p>Camp Merrick decided to decline sheltering vulnerable populations. The Smallwood State Park cabins do not have bathrooms attached and are not usable for this operation. 

	<p><i>ESSENCE data for urgent care utilization at Patient First in Waldorf saw a decrease in patients from 31 on Wednesday, April 1 to 17 on Thursday, April 2. 17 patients presented for a multitude of symptoms. All were discharged to home for self-care. 4 presented with ILI. Diagnoses included sinusitis and pharyngitis.</i></p> <p><i>ESSENCE ED visit data for the University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center also shows no high utilization alert or warning for 4/2. There were 72 ED patients on 4/2. The epidemiologist read the reports on each case where the chief complaint included flu like or possible COVID-19 symptoms (N=19 for 4/2). COVID-19 case or COVID-19 PUI was listed in the provider diagnosis and notes for 5 cases. ESSENCE does not indicate any admissions; however, the discharge disposition was left as "none" for 16 people. This will address sanitation at homeless encampments</i></p> <p>Food services</p> <p><i>End Hunger in Charles County is working collaboratively to provide emergency food, prepared meals, and other meal items to children and households in need. The goal is to work in a coordinated effort to maximize all available resources and to avoid duplication of effort. The organization will assist existing programs through funding and other resources as needed. We have partnered with agencies to provide the following services in Charles County:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Community Cabanas: Charles County Cares - Cabana #9 was installed at the Newburg Volunteer Fire House today! It is the second to be installed, as Cabana #7 at New Hope COG in Waldorf began operation on Wednesday. LifeStyles is working with volunteers to build, install, and maintain ten cabanas throughout the community, located in areas such as Waldorf, La Plata, Indian Head, and Nanjemoy. These cabanas will provide necessities, such as toiletry items, ready-to-eat food, and water, for those in need. This drive-through process will be maintained by volunteers who will provide services each weekday from 11am – 3pm. This is done through a partnership with End Hunger and Charles County Government.</i> ▪ <i>Meal deliveries: LifeStyles in partnership with other providers and Charles County Public Schools are coordinating the delivery of meals for households with school-age children that are not able to access the daily school meal distribution sites, to seniors who are homebound, and also for those that are homeless that need access to nutritious meals. These meal deliveries are scheduled for weekday deliveries, utilizing homebound delivery protocols developed by the Maryland Food Bank. When the purchase of groceries is more efficient and economic it will be used as an alternative. Activation will be determined by both staffing levels and patient census presenting to the ED.</i></p> <p><i>-The hospital census for today 4/3/2020 = 80</i> <i>-Confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 patient admissions in-house 4/3/2020 = 18</i> <i>PUI's in-house 4/3/2020 = 0</i> <i>-There was 0 patient that tested Positive for COVID-19 that was brought in by EMS on 4/03/2020</i> <i>-There were 0 PUI brought in by EMS 4/03/2020 of which the test result has not yet been received</i> <i>-CRMC has dedicating one unit specifically to be for COVID-19 positive patients or for PUI's that have been admitted to the hospital. Career EMS:	<p>Developing reduction in force plan for if we have a forced significant reduction of force</p> <p>Working with Vol Fire & EMS to develop a safety video for all first responders. Procedural change to patient transfer operations at Charles Regional Medical Center. Effective immediately, EMS clinicians transporting a patient to CRMC will need to contact the Charles County 911 Communications Center when they are approaching the ED (about 3 min. out). Our 911 Comms Center will alert CRMC who will send staff out to meet the ambulance and transition patient care at the exterior ED entrance. The transfer of patient care will be conducted outside of the ED. Decon and resupply procedures will be conducted outside of the ED. 

AMENDING AND RESTATING THE ORDER DATED MARCH 16, 2020
TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING EVICTIONS OF TENANTS SUFFERING
SUBSTANTIAL LOSS OF INCOME DUE TO COVID-19, AND ADDITIONALLY
PROHIBITING CERTAIN REPOSSESSIONS, STOPPING INITIATION OF
RESIDENTIAL MORTGAGE FORECLOSURES, PROHIBITING COMMERCIAL
EVICTIONS, AND ALLOWING SUSPENSION OF CERTAIN LENDING LIMITS

WHEREAS, A state of emergency and catastrophic health emergency was proclaimed on March 5, 2020, and renewed on March 17, 2020, to control and prevent the spread of COVID-19 within the state, and the state of emergency and catastrophic health emergency still exists;

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory disease that spreads easily from person to person and may result in serious illness or death, is a public health catastrophe and has been confirmed throughout Maryland;

WHEREAS, The spread of COVID-19 is likely to result in loss of work and loss of income for some residents of Maryland, which may impact their ability to pay for rental housing or repay mortgages, potentially resulting in loss of housing due to eviction or foreclosure;

WHEREAS, The spread of COVID-19 is likely to result in loss of business and income for some businesses in Maryland, which may impact their ability to pay for rental real estate, potentially resulting in eviction;

WHEREAS, To treat, prevent, or reduce the spread of COVID-19 caused by the transmission of the novel coronavirus, it may become medically necessary and reasonable to require individuals to remain in isolation or quarantine at their homes or to remain indoors;

WHEREAS,

To protect the public health, welfare, and safety, it is necessary to suspend the effect of certain states, rules, or regulations of agencies of the State or political subdivisions relating to real property and breach of leases;

WHEREAS,

To protect life and property, and control the public health catastrophe in Maryland, it is necessary to control the occupancy and use of buildings; and

WHEREAS,

To avoid the serious health, welfare, and safety consequences that may result if Marylanders lose their housing as a result of COVID-19, it is necessary and reasonable to impose a moratorium on certain evictions and prevent the initiation of residential foreclosures;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LAWRENCE J. HOGAN, JR., GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME BY THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF MARYLAND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO TITLE 14 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, AND IN AN EFFORT TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, AND SAFETY, DO HEREBY ORDER:

I. The Order of the Governor of the State of Maryland, dated March 16, 2020, entitled "Temporarily Prohibiting Evictions of Tenants Suffering Substantial Loss of Income Due to COVID-19" is amended and restated in its entirety as set forth herein.

II. Definitions. As used herein, the following terms have the following meaning:

- a. "Chattel Home" means personal property used as a person's residence, including without limitation, mobile homes, trailers, and live-aboard boats.
- b. "CL" means the Commercial Law Article of the Maryland Code.
- c. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Financial Regulation of the State of Maryland.
- d. "Creditor" means a lender, credit grantor, lessor, or secured party.
- e. "RP" means the Real Property Article of the Maryland Code.
- f. "Substantial Loss of Income" means (i) with respect to an individual, a substantial loss of income resulting from COVID-19 or the related proclamation of a state of emergency and catastrophic health emergency, including, without limitation, due to job loss, reduction in compensated hours of work, closure of place of employment, or the need to miss work to care for a home-bound school-age child; and (ii) with respect to an entity, a substantial loss of income resulting from COVID-19 or the related proclamation of a state of

emergency and catastrophic health emergency, including, without limitation, due to lost or reduced business, required closure, or temporary or permanent loss of employees.

III. Prohibition on Certain Repossessions. To the extent any statute, rule or regulation of the State of Maryland or any political subdivision would permit a Creditor to repossess any automobile, truck, or Chattel Home by self-help (including, without limitation, CL §§ 9-609, 12-115, 12-624, 12-1021, or 14-2008), such statute, rule, or regulation is hereby suspended until the state of emergency is terminated and the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded.

IV. No Initiation of Residential Foreclosures. The Commissioner is hereby ordered to suspend the operation of the Commissioner's Notice of Intent to Foreclose Electronic System, and to discontinue acceptance of Notices of Intent to Foreclose until the state of emergency is terminated and the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded.

V. Prohibition on Residential and Commercial Evictions.

a. Until the state of emergency is terminated and the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded, the effect of RP § 8-401 is hereby suspended as follows:

i. No court shall give any judgment for possession or repossession, or warrant for restitution of possession or repossession of residential, commercial, or industrial real property, if the tenant can demonstrate to the court, through documentation or other objectively verifiable means, that the tenant suffered a Substantial Loss of Income.

b. Until the state of emergency is terminated and the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded, the effect of RP § 8-402.1 is hereby suspended as follows:

i. No court shall give any judgment for possession or repossession, or warrant for restitution of possession or repossession of residential, commercial, or industrial real property, if the tenant can demonstrate to the court, through documentation or other objectively verifiable means, that the tenant suffered a Substantial Loss of Income.

ii. The fact that the tenant, or any person permissibly cohabiting with the tenant in accordance with the terms of the lease, has a confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 or is under investigation for COVID-19, shall not constitute a "clear and imminent danger" for purposes of RP § 8-402.1(a)(1)(i)2.A.

c. Except as specifically suspended in paragraph V.a above, RP § 8-401 remains in effect in accordance with its terms. Except as specifically suspended in paragraph V.b above, RP § 8-402.1 remains in effect in accordance with its terms.

VI. Authority to Suspend Certain Lending Limits.

a. Upon the request of a State-chartered commercial bank, the Commissioner is hereby authorized to suspend any provision of Section 3-601 of the Financial

Institutions Article of the Maryland Code to allow such State-chartered bank to engage in a transaction or series of transactions exceeding the limits in that Section, if the Commissioner finds that doing so would not reasonably be expected to impair the safety or soundness of the State-chartered commercial bank.

b. Upon the request of a credit union, the Commissioner is hereby authorized to suspend Section 6-604 of the Financial Institutions Article of the Maryland Code to allow such credit union to engage in a transaction or series of transactions exceeding the limit in that Section, if the Commissioner finds that doing so would not reasonably be expected to impair the safety or soundness of the credit union.

VII. General Provisions.

a. No provision of this Order shall be construed as relieving any person or entity of any obligation to make payments or to comply with any other obligation that such person or entity may have pursuant to a note, loan agreement, or lease.


b. This Order remains effective until the state of emergency is terminated and the proclamation of the catastrophic health emergency is rescinded, or until rescinded, superseded, amended, or revised by any subsequent order(s).

c. The effect of any statute, rule, or regulation of an agency of the State or a political subdivision inconsistent with this order is hereby suspended.

d. The underlined headings in this Order are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Order.

e. If any provision of this Order or its application to any person, entity, or circumstance is held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions or applications of the Order shall remain in effect to the extent possible without the invalid provision or application. To achieve this purpose, the provisions of this Order are severable.


