



Diagnoses included sinusitis, allergic rhinitis, Strep pharyngitis.</i></p> <p><i>ESSENCE ED visit data for the University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center also shows no high utilization alerts or warnings for 4/3, 4/4, 4/5. There were 67 ED patients on 4/3, 55 patients on 4/4, and 52 patients on 4/5. The epidemiologist read the reports on each case where the chief complaint included flu like or possible COVID-19 symptoms (N=17 for 4/3, N=11 for 4/4, and N=21 for 4/5). COVID-19 case or COVID-19 PUI was listed in the provider diagnosis and notes for 6 cases.</i></p> <p><i>ESSENCE does not indicate any admissions; however, the discharge disposition was left as "none" for 35 people. 	<p>Food services</p> <p><i>End Hunger in Charles County identified a vendor that may be able to provide additional food. Due to limitations at grocery stores and online we have had difficulty obtaining need items for distribution.</i></p> <p><i>Meal deliveries: Groceries are scheduled to be delivered to 12 families tomorrow. Made contact with LifePoint Church for assistance with volunteers and groceries to continue assistance to these families. LifeStyles in partnership with other providers and Charles County Public Schools are coordinating the delivery of meals for households with school-age children that are not able to access the daily school meal distribution sites, to seniors who are homebound, and also for those that are homeless that need access to nutritious meals. These meal deliveries are scheduled for weekday deliveries, utilizing homebound delivery protocols developed by the Maryland Food Bank. When the purchase of groceries is more efficient and economic it will be used as an alternative. Households must be pre-approved and requests for same-day delivery may be considered but not a guarantee of availability.</i></p> <p>Outreach</p> <p><i>Street outreach was conducted in La Plata and two Waldorf sites. Solar showers were provided to each site. 23 People were provided items today to include nonperishables. The need for more of these items was evident during outreach. There were no children noticed during today's outreach.</i></p> <p><i>Through assistance from the Department of Social Services and the La Plata Police we were able to assist an elderly couple who were displaced due to COVID19 restrictions at a senior living facility.</i></p>

There are currently 10 patients in the ICU, with an additional surge on a Surge ICU unit of 3 patient. Total in-house ICU patients to include surge for 4/6/2020 = 13</i></p> <p><i>Number of ventilators owned by CRMC = 17. As of 4/6/2020 there are 8 patients on ventilators.
