


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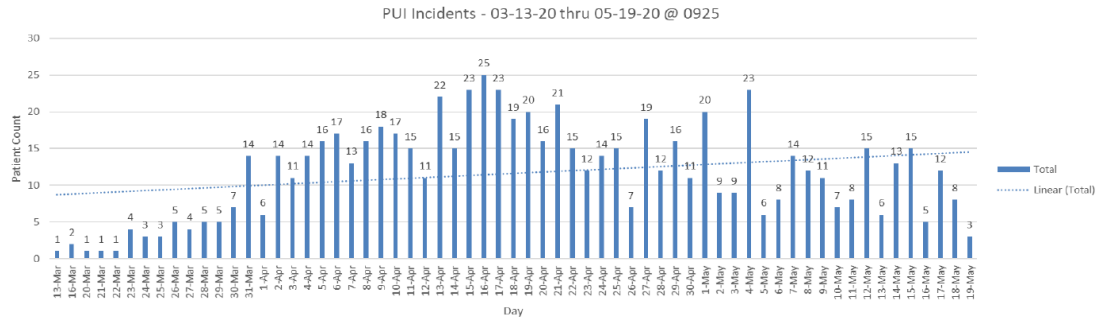

We continue to provide face coverings to individuals living in encampments who were without.
