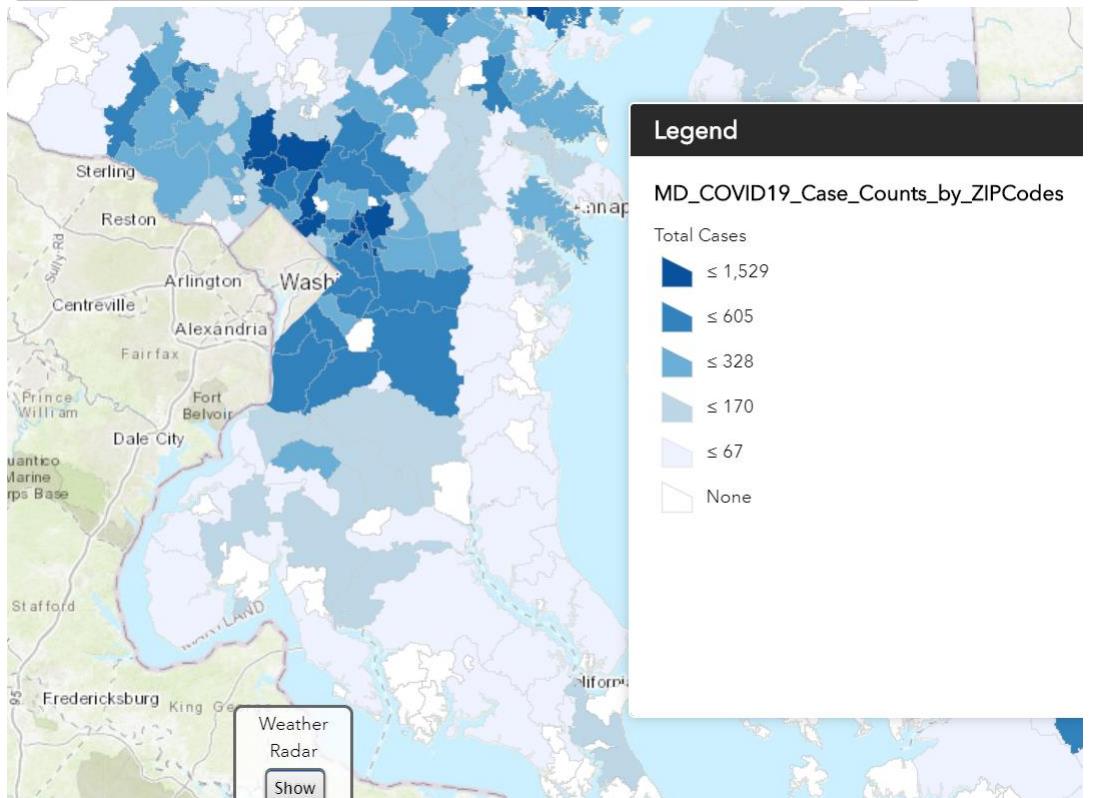

<b>COVID Confirmed cases in Charles County</b>	<i>946 cases total reported since the beginning of the event.</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Under 18 years: 27 (2.9%)</li><li>• 18-64 years: 691 (77.3%)</li><li>• 65+ years: 180 (19.8%)</li></ul> <i>4920 negative tests results</i>  <i>The State of MD is reporting 943, which is the number of cases from the State Labs.</i>  <i>Recovered and released from isolation: 250</i> <i>Partially recovered with improved symptoms: 56</i> <i>Known asymptomatic cases: 19</i> <i>174 or 18.4% required hospitalization. Hospitalization rate is steadily decreasing. 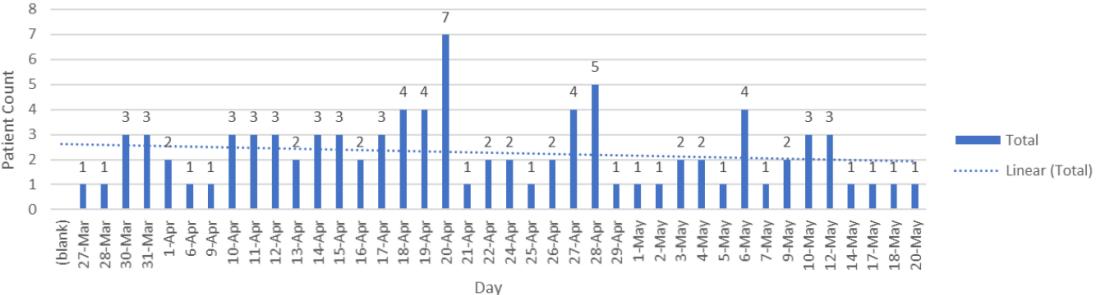
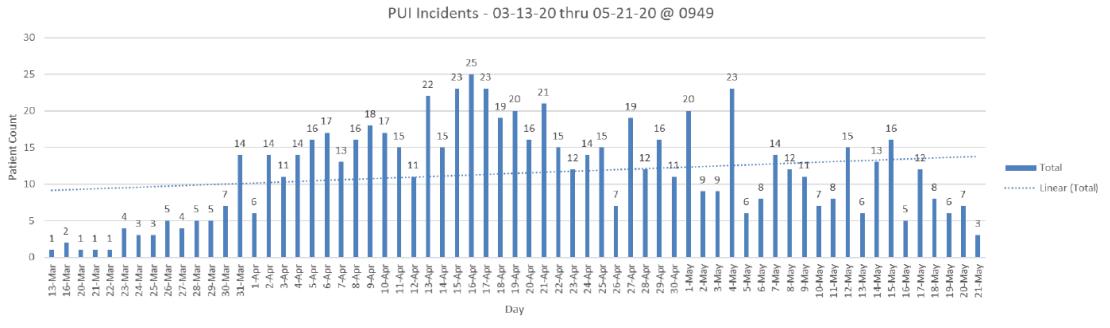
