



PIO:	<p><i>County PIO will conduct an interview with Channel 4 and Commissioner Collins at Greene Turtle this evening regarding outdoor dining.</i></p> <p><i>The Health Department PIO team has nothing to report at this time.</i></p>
Schools:	<p><i>Meals:</i></p> <p><i>Thursday, 5/28/20 CCPS served 7053 meals at the 11 meal distribution sites. The total was +2367 from the meals served on Wednesday, 5/27/20 due to the large volume of elementary packet pickup.</i></p> <p><i>Meal sites located at high schools are closed on the day of their graduation events. Sites will be closed at Lackey and McDonough on June 1, at Westlake on June 2 and St. Charles on June 3. All other meal sites will operate as usual. CCPS is working on arrangements to implement the summer meals program Lunch on Us. CCPS will share details as they are finalized.</i></p> <p><i>Closure:</i></p> <p><i>Schools have sent out schedules to parents and students as to what days and times they can report to the schools to pick up their personal belongings still at the schools. This will occur within the next two weeks.</i></p> <p><i>State Superintendent of Schools Karen Salmon announced all Maryland public schools will remain closed until the end of the 2019-20 school year.
