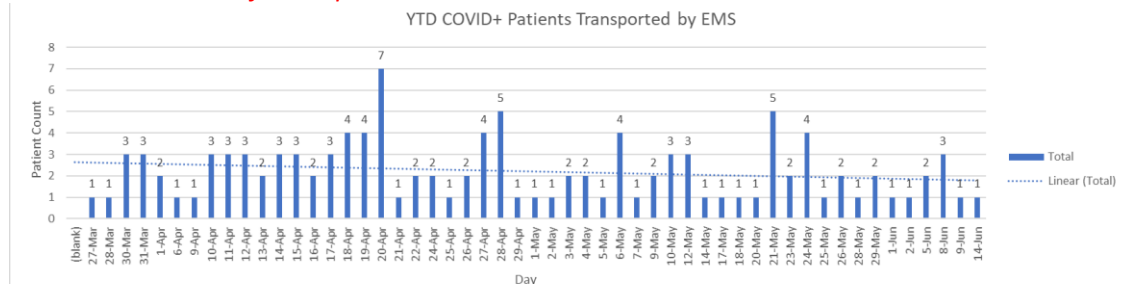



Schools:	<p><i>Meals:</i></p> <p><i>Tuesday, 6/16/20 CCPS served 3420 meals at the 11 meal distribution sites. The total was +532 from the meals served on Monday, 6/15/20. We are seeing a drop in meals being served at our 11 meal distribution sites.</i></p> <p><i>The Summer Meals Program</i> is a free meals program for all children and youth ages 18 and younger who live in Charles County.</p> <p><i>Due to the COVID-19 social distancing requirements, Charles County Public Schools (CCPS) will continue to serve Grab and Go meals at our eleven existing meal sites beginning Friday, June 12 through Tuesday, June 30 between the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. CCPS will serve Summer Meals throughout the summer months until August 14; however, we are awaiting direction from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) regarding our Summer Meals Program beyond June 30. More information will follow.</i></p> <p><i>CCPS meal distribution sites can provide parents food without their child being present. However, the pick-up person must be a child's parent or guardian. Parents/guardians must show staff their child's CCPS student identification (ID) badge or report card copy showing their student ID number.</i></p> <p><i>Parents with children not yet enrolled in school should attempt to bring some type of age verification to show to site staff, such as a copy of a birth certificate.</i></p> <p><i>There will be no need for parents to exit their vehicles to obtain the meals. Parents and guardians need only show their child's ID badge or report card to a staff member on site. The 11 meal sites operate 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday through Friday. Students can take a maximum of two make-up courses during summer school. The cost of make-up courses has been waived by CCPS this year. Summer school also offers four courses for original credit and are \$300 each. Registration begins at 8 a.m. June 17. All courses run July 7 through Aug. 6. Read here for more information.

Lifestyles:	<p><u>Food services</u></p> <p>Through the Governor's Office, Farmlink, Piscataway Conoy Tribe and End Hunger as well as many community partners and businesses 4,600 gallons of milk was distributed throughout Charles County.</p> <p>Eight (8) cabanas operated today as well as curbside distributions. Since April 15th over 21,840 meals have been provided to County residents. Providing 226 anytime bags and 65 toiletry bags today. Currently 94 volunteers are assisting with food distribution and cabanas.</p> <p>Volunteers will prepare another 1600 anytime bags for distribution through next Friday. 17 meals were delivered to homebound and homeless individuals today. 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	<p><i>LifeStyles of Maryland is a Maryland Diaper Bank Diaper Hub to support COVID 19 relief efforts. Diapers were distributed to 27 families from Saturday the 13th thru yesterday.</i></p> <p><i>Outreach numbers – 83 unduplicated persons have been served through Street outreach during the pandemic. Waldorf sanitation station is in full use and will continue til June 29th. Coordination with DSS continues. This shared outreach is beneficial to the homeless population. We continue to provide face coverings to individuals living in encampments who were without or needed replacements. The Charles County Health Department provided 350 face masks. Trying to maintain access to water for clients. Staff is continuing to work with the Department of Community Services to house eligible individuals as quickly as possible.</i></p> <p><i>We are coordinating testing for shelters and homeless population with the health department. Angel's Watch. Testing took place on the 10th of June. Fuller House & other transitional houses will take place on 6/18/2020.</i></p> <p><i>LifeStyles is implementing restoring services gradually. We are ordering and awaiting supplies. The regional COC is coordinating with shelter providers to address congregate shelters considering COVID-19.
