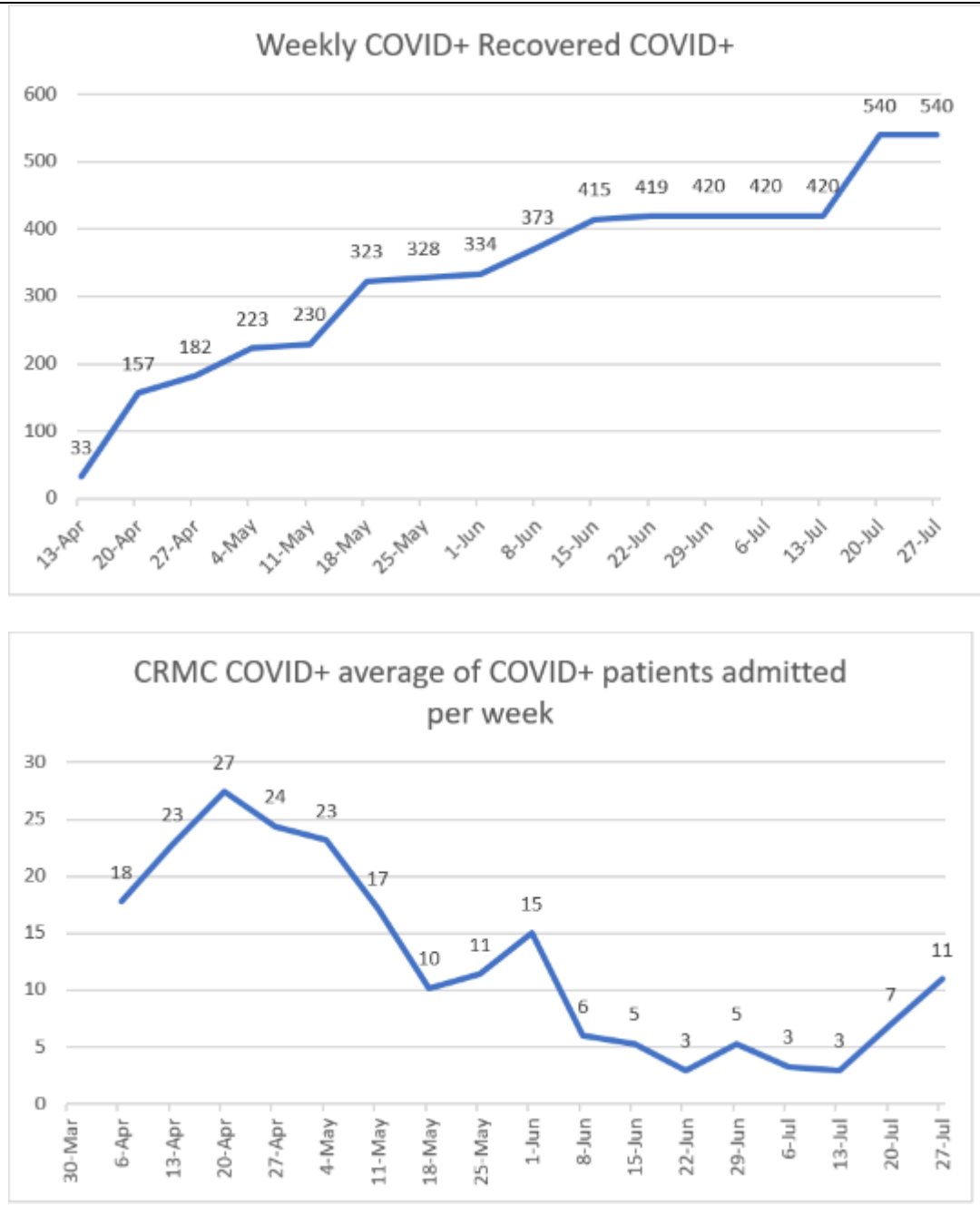

These are two of the lowest rates in Prince George's County. These rates are much closer to Waldorf and White Plains case rates.

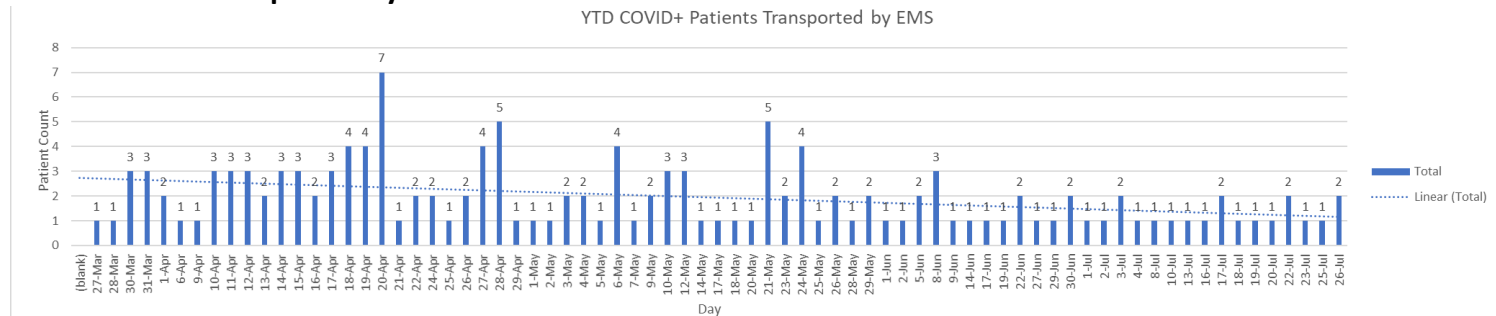
