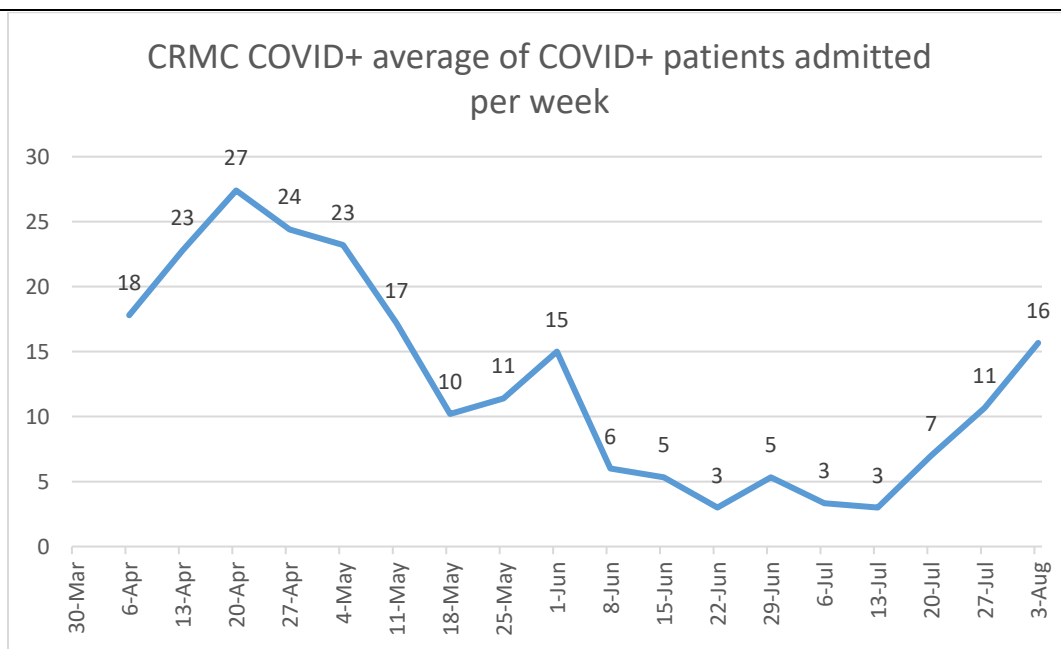

	<p>Data on average number of days from specimen collection date to public health reporting will be done on a weekly basis and reported on the Friday report. Updated numbers will be provided on the Monday report.</p> <p>Recovered and released from isolation: 485</p> <p>Partially recovered with improved symptoms: 55</p> <p>Known asymptomatic cases: 40</p> <p>This number has not been updated by Infectious Disease Program. When I get back from vacation, I will be working with the other epidemiologists in the state to get more information from COVIDlink on how to build reports so I can get this information out of the system on my own. A meeting is scheduled for August 11th.</p> <p>270 or 13.5% required hospitalization. Hospitalization rate is steadily decreasing. Peak in hospitalization rate coincided with the peak in the skilled nursing facility outbreaks.</p> <p>There has been an increase in the number of people currently hospitalized for COVID-19, in both acute care and in the ICU. According to the MIEMSS FRED report in CRISP, there were 9 COVID-19 positive cases in acute care and 6 COVID-19 positive in the ICU on 8/6.</p> <p>Among confirmed cases, 1137 (57.2%) Female; 852 (42.8%) Male</p> <p>8.4% Healthcare Workers</p> <p>1% First Responders: EMS, Fire, Law Enforcement</p> <p>65% have underlying health conditions</p>
