Data from CovidLink:

11,250 case records for Charles County in CovidLink to date. This data is a combination of data coming from CRISP, the MDH confirmed cases databases, and the data collected during the contact tracing interview/follow-up process.

Of cases who reported having symptoms (49.2%)*, the most common symptoms were cough, congestion/runny nose, headache, muscle aches/pain, and loss of taste and/or smell.
5,148 cases reported having no COVID-19 symptoms (45.8%)*.

*10,688 out of 11,250 cases reported whether or not they were experiencing COVID-19 symptoms. Due to this, these percentages will not add up to 100%.

944 required hospitalization*, or 8.7% of the confirmed cases. Percentage of COVID-19 cases hospitalized has decreased weekly since the second peak in December-January.

	<p>206 confirmed deaths, 13 additional deaths since previous report.*</p> <p><i>* Due to some medical certifiers not following the CDC provided guidance to use the full term of 'COVID-19' when entering the cause of death, the Vital Statistics Administration has uncovered an additional 538 COVID-19 deaths previously not reported in Maryland; 12 of which are from Charles County. These additional COVID-19 deaths in Charles County are from previous months; there has been one additional COVID-19 death for the month of May 2021 since the last report.</i></p> <p>There have been 206 confirmed deaths associated with COVID-19. This equates to 1.9% of total confirmed cases. The Charles County death rate of 1.9% is below the MD state average death rate of 2.0%. We have seen a decrease in the average age of COVID-19 related deaths now that the majority of individuals in the 65+ population have been vaccinated.</p> <p>There are 2 probable COVID-19 deaths. COVID-19 is listed as the cause of death due to symptoms indicative of disease and/or the case was epidemiologically linked to a COVID-1 outbreak. 

Percent Vaccinated (Ages 12 and older):


